During the summer, students can lose as much as 22% of what they learned in reading by not putting it into practice. We're hoping to help prevent the summer slide and you can help by encouraging your child to read over the summer. This summer, we will be having a "Summer Passport" challenge. Encourage your child to earn passport stamps by completing the tasks on each stamp. Your child should read for at least 10 minutes for each challenge.

The challenges are divided into six different categories:

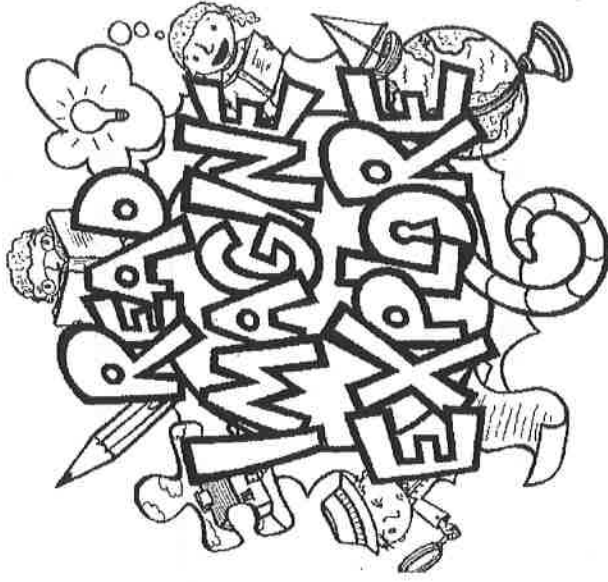
- Who - challenges students to read to parents, brothers, sisters, pets, stuffed animals, friends, etc.
- What - challenges students to read a variety of reading materials
- When - challenges students to read at various times
- Where - challenges students to read in different places
- Why - challenges students to read for different reasons
